



Country Court Sustainability Statement

Country Court aims to be carbon neutral by 2050, with numerous initiatives in place across the group we are committed to achieving our sustainability goals. Our commitment to environmentally friendly practices in care home operations was made in April 2025 by the Senior Management Team.

- We have an energy committee meeting every quarter to monitor energy usage and see where we can make any changes.
- We encourage homes to recycle, by providing at least 2 no mixed recycling bins at every home.
- General waste and clinical waste are incinerated for the most part which puts power back into the grid.
- In 2025 FoodSaver Sheets will allow our teams to track food waste more effectively, providing valuable insights into waste patterns and helping us fine-tune meal planning and portion control.
- FoodSaver Bins will enable us to segregate food waste efficiently, ensuring it is managed responsibly.
- All taps and showers are fitted with flow restrictors, to reduce water wastage
- We encourage homes to keep windows closed in the winter to reduce heat wastage, and open windows in the summer to allow the flow of air before resorting to using the AC
- Energy and water consumption is monitored throughout the month, and any anomalies are identified and rectified promptly to avoid wastage.
- All new homes will meet sustainability guidelines set by funders, including air source heat pumps and solar PV panels.
- Our new developments at Nettleham in Lincolnshire and Chippenham in Wiltshire are being built to meet sustainability guidelines. These new care homes will feature air source heat pumps, solar panels, and utilise locally sourced materials where possible.
